




LSE Campus Map

The CKK is the Cheng Kin Ku building where the summit will be held on the 23rd








Local Area Map

Above is the walking route to Clement House










Above is the walking route to the Cheng Kin Ku building










Above is the walking route from the Cheng Kin Ku building to Hotel AMANO for the networking social
